Reviled - John 9:28; **λοιδρέω** (loidreo) :to abuse, revile. John 9:28; Acts 23:4; I Corinthians 4:12; I Peter 2:23.*

You...we – John 9:28; **σὺ...ἡμεῖς** (su...haymays) : Note how often in this passage we see the emphatic use of personal pronouns in Greek. The verb forms include the function of the pronoun, so when the separate personal pronoun is used, in many cases it emphasizes the contrast between groups of people. See :24 '**we** know'; :27 'do **you** want to become His disciples, too?' (expecting a 'no' answer); :28, '**You** are a disciple of that one, but **we** are disciples of Moses'; :29, '**We** know that God spoke to Moses, but we do not know where this one is from'; :30, 'because **you** do not know where He is from'; :34, 'And they said to him, **You** were born wholly in sin and **you** are teaching us?'; :35, 'Do **you** believe in the Son of God?'; :39, 'and Jesus said, For judgment **I** came into this world'; :40, 'and they said to Him, Are even **we** blind?'

Marvelous thing - John 9:30; **θαυμαστόν** (thaumaston): Wonderful, marvelous. Matthew 21:42; Mark 12:11; John 9:36; I Peter 2:9; Revelation 15:1, 3.*

Worshiper of God – John 9:31; **θεοσεβής** (theosebays): God-fearing, Godly, only here, John 9:31, in the Greek New Testament. In the LXX, Exodus 18:21.*

Worshiped – John 9:38; **προσεκυνέω** (prosekuneo): to show reverence or homage by kissing the hand; in the Greek New Testament, to show reverence or homage by prostrating oneself. Matthew 2:2, 8, 11; 20:20; Luke 4:7; 24:52. To pay divine homage, worship, adore, Matthew 4:10; John 4:20, 21; Hebrews 1:6. To bow oneself in adoration, Hebrews 11:21. Only one time in the Epistles, I Corinthians 14:25.

Judgment – John 9:39; **κρίμα** (krima): Judgment; a sentence Matthew 7:21; a judicial sentence, Luke 23:40; 24:20; Romans 2:2; 5:16; an adverse sentence, Matthew 23:14; Romans 13:2; I Timothy 5:12; James 3:1. Judgment, administration of justice, John 9:39; Acts 24:25. Execution of justice, I Peter 4:17. A lawsuit, I Corinthians 6:7. Judicial visitation, I Corinthians 11:29; II Peter 2:3. An administrative decree, Romans 11:33.
